OUR WORK

Special education and accessing disability services can add additional stress to families. Funded by DCF, The Family Advocacy, Support, and Training (FAST) program focuses on supporting families with a child with an intellectual/developmental disability or a dual diagnosis of I/DD and mental illness. Through intensive educational support, we help parents understand their role and rights in special education. We attend IEP meetings, and provide peer to peer support. We help families connect to disability resources in their communities and provide opportunities for family members to connect with one another, reducing the feeling of isolation.

Community partnerships and connections with other families are fostered through FAST, so families know they aren't alone.

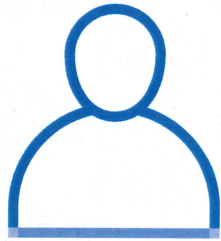


FUNDING

Ascension Via Christi's Behavioral Health team is committed to finding the best solution for patients by offering many treatment options including; inpatient, outpatient and partial-day programs.

The inpatient program provides the most intensive forms of treatment with the goal of stabilizing patients in a safe environment through medication management and group therapy.

The intensive outpatient program offers medication education and management and group therapy, with a focus on the development of healthy life skills.

The partial-day program provides more intensive outpatient therapy to those with a diagnosed mental illness, with age-specific programs for those 11-17 years old and adults 18 and older.

Inpatient program

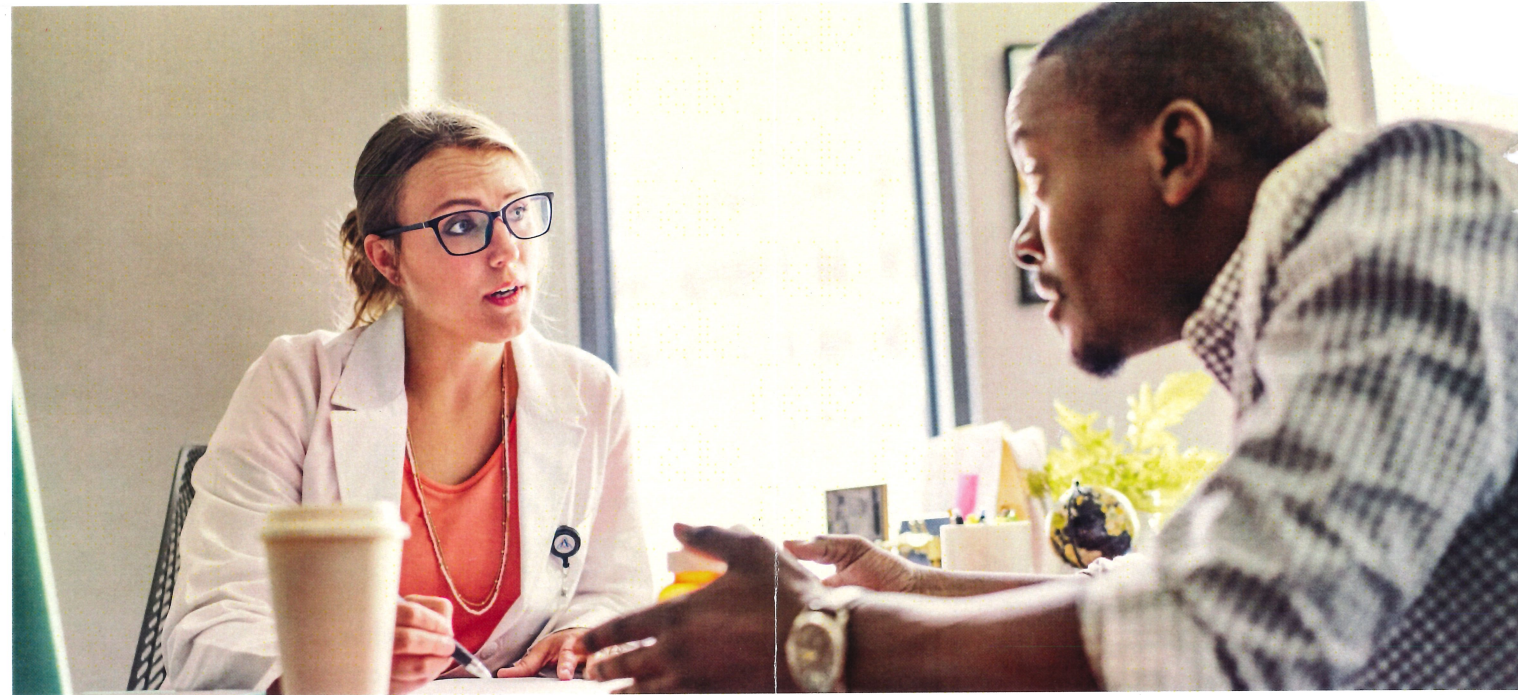
The Ascension Via Christi Behavioral Health Center provides four levels of inpatient care:

- Acute psychiatric care, for patients with acute symptoms including thoughts of suicide, severe depression or psychosis
- Adult psychiatric care, where structured individual and group treatment is provided for patients with less acute symptoms and medical detoxification for chemically dependent patients is available
- Adolescent care, designed to meet the unique clinical and educational needs of 12- to 17-year-old patients in need of crisis stabilization and short-term hospitalization
- Care for chronically mentally ill patients

Providing integrated medical and behavioral healthcare for patients ages 4 to adulthood with 101 all-new private rooms located at Ascension Via Christi St. Joseph.

- 50 adult rooms
- 25 senior rooms
- 14 adolescent rooms (10 rooms for ages 11 to 17, four rooms for ages 4 to 11)
- 12 medical psych safe rooms (built to accommodate patients requiring dialysis; oxygen, IV medications, or other medical interventions)

All inpatient services require a referral.



Partial-day program

Ascension Via Christi's partial-day program is the most intensive form of outpatient therapy and psychoeducation for treating and managing a mental illness while allowing the patient to live at home.

- Patients attend five days a week, six hours a day, Monday-Friday, 8 a.m.-3 p.m.
- Adolescent program (11-17)
- Adult program (18 and older)

Intensive outpatient program

Ascension Via Christi's intensive outpatient program is a less intensive option providing the same type of service as the partial-day program.

- Patients attend three days a week, six hours a day, Monday-Friday, 8 a.m.-3 p.m.
- Includes adolescent and adult programs

Patients may benefit from outpatient programs if they have:

- A primary psychiatric diagnosis (Axis I) other than substance abuse/dependence
- Adequate cognitive ability to benefit from educational and therapeutic offerings
- Evening and weekend support
- Access to transportation

Patients who enroll in these intensive, short-term programs must be:

- Willing to participate
- Expecting progress within a specified time period
- Able to function safely without 24-hour medical/psychiatric care
- Not a threat to self or others

These services do not require a referral.

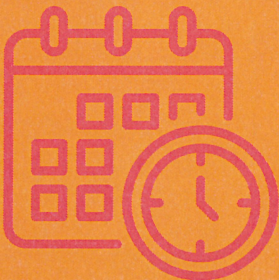
Population Served

WHAT IS CARE MANAGEMENT?

MHA provides a special type of service called Care Management.



We connect you or your child with services to help you improve your health and stay as healthy as possible.

Our services begin with a team learning about the needs that affect you or your child's physical and mental health. This can be done in your home or in a provider's office.

Once the Care Management Team knows your needs, we will work with you to set goals and make plans to meet them. The goals you have for your health are an important part of the plan

WHAT WE DO

Our Care Management Team works closely with your provider. This helps us to:

- Work with you to help you understand and participate in your plan of care.
- Set goals with you to improve your health.
- Review your medications to be sure you know how to take them correctly.
- Ensure access to the correct medications.
- Follow up with you after a hospital admission or emergency room visit.
- Help resolve any barriers to attending medical appointments, especially after a hospital or emergency room visit.
- Provide you with tools, resources, and support to help you manage your health

BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES IN SEDGWICK COUNTY ADDITIONAL Q&A RESPONSES

Who can work with schools to let students know of your work and how they pursue careers in mental health and crisis/non-crisis care?

- “Workforce: To have enough employees to meet demand in mental health, substance abuse, social work and other behavioral health professions” is an identified priority of the Mental Health and Substance Abuse Coalition (MHSAC). WSU Tech and MHSAC are working together to address the career ladder. With these efforts, plans include outreach to the USD259 Superintendent to discuss this very question. - Many organizations offer practicum or internship opportunities for those engaged in a formal education program with a number of colleges and universities. These providers also engage in presentations to classes of students when invited or engaged by schools and also participate in job fairs or recruitment activities hosted at a variety of institutions of higher education.

What is your biggest challenge you are facing on a day-to-day basis?

- According to Dawn Shepler, Executive Director For the MHSAC, the biggest challenge is ensuring that the public is educated about the projects (hospital, school, crisis center and MAC) happening and how individuals in the community can play a part in helping bring those projects forward. The hard part is how to reach all of the community who may have a need to know or interest in the projects. Dawn reports the need to ensure robust communication throughout all parts of the County is the biggest challenge.
- Sedgwick County (COMCARE & Emergency Communications) hiring part-time and full-time positions to provide 24/7 services which includes second and third shift opportunities. These positions often require bachelor’s or master’s degrees.
- Substance Abuse Center of Kansas also experiences workforce challenges. It seems that many providers of substance use disorder treatment are unable to find enough qualified, licensed addiction counselors for the identified need within the community.

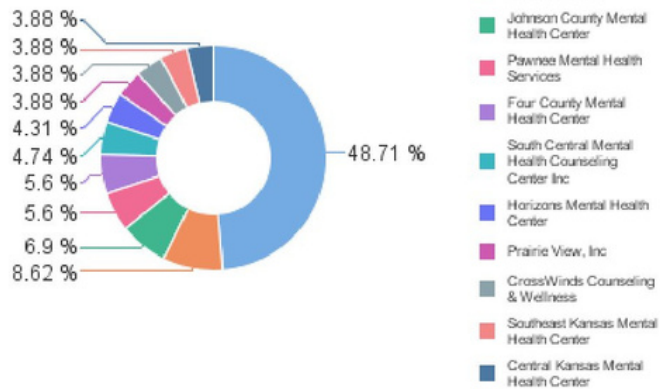

The following statistics show demographics of Kansas Youth contacting the Kansas DCF Crisis Line for a rolling 12mo timeframe.

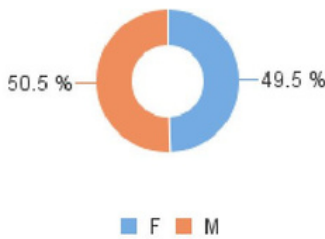

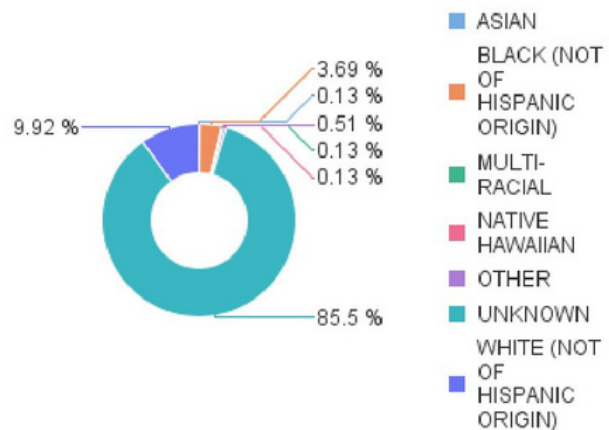
Top 10 Catchment Areas



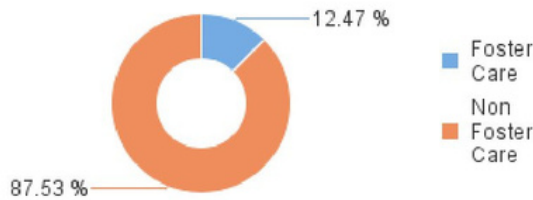
GENDER



RACE



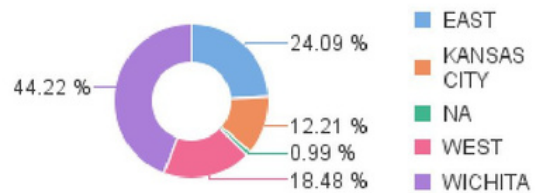
